IOWA GREAT LAKES BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT: Brad Beck updated the Council on the Promenade Project. The weather has been pushing back the start time of the project; however, the goal is to have the Promenade finished by Memorial Day.

ONE-WAY LAKESHORE DRIVE: The City Council approved an ordinance in May, 2018 to turn the portion of Lakeshore Drive-way in front of the Central Emporium into a one-way street. After hearing concerns from a neighboring business owner and discussion with the Imagine IGL representative, Brad Beck, it was decided the one-way traffic would function better going from west to east. It is the consensus of the Council to proceed with the publication of the ordinance; as well as, the implementation of appropriate signage.

FY2019 – 2020 BUDGET: Mayor Pro-tem Richter opened the Public Hearing at 5:40 p.m. No comments, written or verbal, were received. Richter explained with the residents of Arnolds Park voting to increase the hotel/motel tax from 5% to 7%, the City was able to decrease the tax levy from \$5.25 per \$1,000.00 of valuation to \$4.95. Mayor Pro-tem Richter closed the Public Hearing at 5:41 p.m. **RESOLUTION NO. 08-19** ADOPTING THE PROPOSED BUDGET FY2019 – 2020. Introduced by Christensen. Seconded by Jensen. The roll was called and the vote was: Ayes: Christensen, Jensen, Richter, Watters. Nays: None. Absent: Adams.

COMPASS POINTE: Merle Hinton with Compass Pointe shared a few key points on tobacco usage in the state of Iowa. Compass Pointe is partnering with Healthy Hometown Commission to work with cities to create enforceable Tobacco-Free/Nicotine-Free Policy guidelines for use with City Parks. Jensen is concerned on how it would be enforced. The Council took no action.

MISCELLANEOUS NON-ACTION ITEMS: Linda Nase informed the Council the City is now taking applications for Deputy City Clerk. The Planning and Zoning Commission has been meeting to discuss changes to the City's Zoning Ordinance. Nase also mentioned, in April, an item on the agenda will be for the Council to discuss possible rezoning of the three lots directly east of City Hall.
