COUNCIL PRESENT: Christensen, Adams, Richter, Jensen, Watters. Mayor Hussong presided.

OTHERS PRESENT: Jeff Rose, Jeremy Kleve, Alan Krueger, Steve Schwaller, Jon Pausley, Chris Yungbluth.

LAKE STREET CLOSURE: The Council reviewed the recommendation of the Arnolds Park Street Committee regarding Lake Street closure for 2023. Jon Pausley representing the Arnolds Park Amusement Park, informed the Council that Rock the Roof is moving to Wednesday evenings in 2023. Pausley also stated that in 2023 there will be a handicap drop-off and parking area near the new stage. Motion to approve the following 2023 Lake Street Closures and signage:

- Open Monday and Tuesday.
- Open Wednesday until 3 p.m., then closed for Rock the Roof.
- Closed Thursday, Friday, and Sunday beginning one hour before the Amusement Park opens
- Closed Saturday beginning at 8 a.m.
- When Lake Street is open (Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday) bollards 2, 3, 4, and 5 are removed. Bollard 1 and 6 shall remain in place.
- When Lake Street is closed (Wednesday at 3 p.m., Thursday, Friday, Saturday beginning at Noon, and Sunday), bollards 3 and 4 are removed and a small fence is put in place between bollards 2 and 5.
- All bollards (1-6) shall be in place during the Saturday morning Farmer's Market.
- Lake Street shall open each night one hour after the Amusement Park closes and remain open all night. The two center bollards (3 and 4) and the fence shall not be in place as to allow for police patrol and emergency access.
- Golf carts shall not be allowed on Lake Street when it is closed with the exception of garbage carts and fuel carts.
- Historic Arnolds Park, Inc. shall install a sign on the fence listing a park phone number for patrons to contact for assistance.

Watters/Richter. Ayes: Five. Nays: None. Absent: None. Consensus of the Council is that Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day shall be treated as weekends.

CHAPTER 122 PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, & TRANSIENT MERCHANTS: Council discussed various sections of Chapter 122 including hours of operation, signage, permit length, definition of "event", and types of merchants. Council formed a committee consisting of Adams, Watters, and Mayor Hussong to review Chapter 122 and submit recommendations at the December 14, 2022 Council Meeting. Motion to set a Public Hearing for discussion and possible changes to Chapter 122 Peddlers, Solicitors, & Transient Merchants on December 14, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. Watters/Christensen. Ayes: Five. Nays: None. Absent: None.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: Chief Krueger met with the Personnel Committee to request a wage increase for reserve officers. The Personnel Committee recommended to the Council a wage increase to match the rate paid to the volunteer firefighters. **RESOLUTION NO. 30-2022** RESOLUTION APPROVING RESERVE OFFICER WAGE INCREASE.
